Every horse owner should keep this information current and easily accessible:

✓ Owner & Emergency Contacts

- Primary owner contact information
- Secondary emergency contact

✓ Veterinary & Farrier

- Primary veterinarian and emergency clinic
- Farrier contact information

✓ Horse Identification

- Horse description, markings, and photos
- Registration or microchip info (if applicable)

✓ Medical Information

- Vaccination records
- Allergies, conditions, medications
- Normal TPR values

✓ Emergency Authorization

- Permission for emergency veterinary care
- Spending limits or insurance details

✓ Special Care Notes

- Blanketing preferences
- Turnout or handling instructions
