Every horse owner should keep this information current and easily accessible:

### **✓ Owner & Emergency Contacts**

- Primary owner contact information
- Secondary emergency contact

### **✓ Veterinary & Farrier**

- Primary veterinarian and emergency clinic
- Farrier contact information

### **✓ Horse Identification**

- Horse description, markings, and photos
- Registration or microchip info (if applicable)

### **✓ Medical Information**

- Vaccination records
- Allergies, conditions, medications
- Normal TPR values

### **✓ Emergency Authorization**

- Permission for emergency veterinary care
- Spending limits or insurance details

### **✓ Special Care Notes**

- Blanketing preferences
- Turnout or handling instructions
